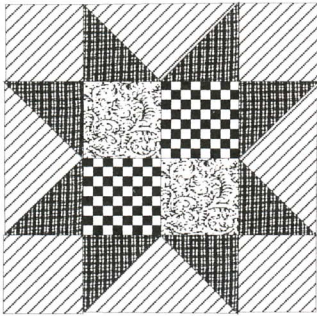


Using your Easy Angle and Companion Angle



You can cut this block using only your Easy Angle and the Companion Angle.

It can be made different sizes depending on what size strips you use to cut your block.

How to use the Easy Angle.

To Cut Triangles

1. Place ruler on your strip right side up. (You can read the name). Line up the size you want with the top and bottom of the strip.
2. Cut against the ruler with your rotary cutter.
3. Flip ruler over and make a second cut along the ruler. You will now have two triangles.
4. If you want to pair up two fabrics for your triangles then place two stripes right sides together and do your cuts. Leave the two pieces of fabric together; they will be ready to sew.

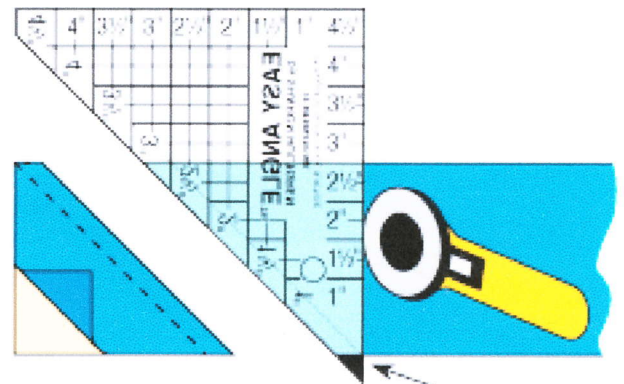
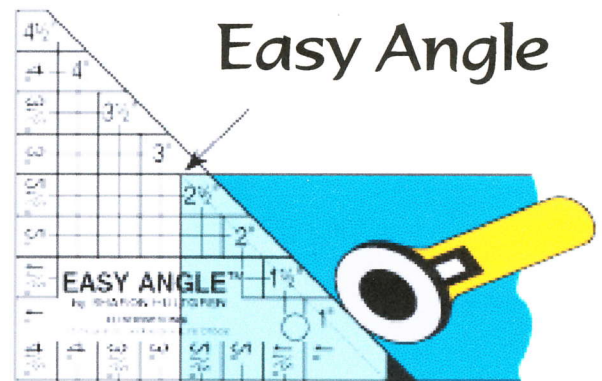
Cut Squares

1. Just line up right angle corner of your ruler on the size you want and cut.

Companion angle

Use the companion angle to cut remaining triangles for the block. You can use the same size strips that you used for your Easy Angles.

1. Place the ruler on your strip right side up. Line up the size you want with the top and bottom of the strip.
2. Cut against the ruler with your rotary cutter.
3. Flip ruler over and make a second cut along the ruler.
4. If you want to make hour glass units out of two colors you can pair up your fabrics right sides together and cut pairs of triangles.
