Supplies needed: Fat quarter; or 2 strips of fabric 6" x 12.5" and 1 strip of insulated batting the same size, 6" x 12.5". Plus; one optional quilt block, applique or an embroidery design no larger than 4" x 4" Adhesive if desired.

- 1. Cut out pattern, two layers of fabric and 1 layer of insulated batting. Make the batting layer a smidge smaller than the fabric.
- 2. Zigzag around the outside edges of one layer of fabric.
- 3. Match the insulated batting to the wrong side of the second piece of fabric and zigzag around the outside edges.
- 4. Next applique quilt or applique block or embroider a design on one side. Add any additional quilting desired at this point also.
- Putting right sides together, stitch the lining to the outside fabric using a ¼" seam across the straight ends. Turn so the batting is on the inside and fabric is outside of the "sandwich". Topstitch at ¼" from the edge.
- 6. Trim any batting that may be sticking out from the fabric. Hopefully this step is not needed.
- 7. Satin stitch or use a dense zigzag around the bottom of the cozy, points A-B-C on both sides.
- 8. With right sides together, line up the side seams and sew ¼" from the edge. Reinforce the starting and stopping of the seams.
- 9. Turn right side out and you're done!

Note: You can lengthen the cozy if desired.
