

Corner Bookmark Instructions

Required supplies are:

- Three 4" squares of fabric. These can be the same fabric or different. I think it's nice to have at least one fabric that is contrasting.
- Three 3 ½" squares of fusible interfacing

1. First fuse the interfacing to the wrong side of two squares of fabric, centering the fusible square on the fabric square.



2. Fold the last square of fabric in half diagonally. Press and open back up. Cut the last square of fusible in half diagonally and fuse it on the open folded fabric square.



3. Stack up your layers. Bottom layer is one square of fabric right side up. Next layer is the folder triangle nudged into the corner. Last layer is the next square right side down.

Sew a ¼" seam around the square leaving an opening to turn on one of the 2 sides which do not have the folded triangle.

Trim the corners so you won't have as much fabric bulk there.



4. Turn your bookmark inside out through the opening. Use something (stiletto, awl, pencil, etc.) to poke out the corners carefully. Iron flat and finally top stitch 1/8" away from the edges of ONLY TWO SIDES that are not the triangle. I think the bookmark works better and hugs the corners of the book pages tighter if there is no top stitching on the triangle.
