

Greeting Cards

This is a great way to save money and use fabric scraps for any type of greeting card. Cards can be made for Christmas or any other holiday, birthday, condolences, graduation, thank you, etc. Blank cards with a theme can be given as gifts. If you don't feel creative when writing on the inside of the card, just refer to Pinterest or other online sources.

Supplies:

5" x 7" cards with open frame*

4" x 6" index cards*

4" x 6" fabric*

Steam a Seam tape (¼" or ½")

Glue or Scotch tape may be needed.

Instructions:

1. Cut fabric of your choice to the size of the index card.
2. Place Steam a Seam tape strips to the 4 sides of one side of the index card. Lightly press the tape to the card. Peel the paper backing off the tape. Place the fabric on the taped side and press.
3. The edges around the frame the card are not always open enough to allow the index card with fabric to slip in. Therefore, it's advisable to run a letter opener or other slim object around the 3 glued edges of the frame to allow the insertion of the index card and fabric. *Note: You may find that one or more corners may come completely unglued. If so, you can either use a little bit of glue or rolled Scotch tape to reseal these segments after Step 4.*
4. Insert the index card and fabric into the frame.

*Framed cards are available in different sizes, so just vary the index cards and fabric pieces to fit the frame opening.

Amazon 5" x 7" frame cards with envelopes (48 – 50 cards are \$16 - \$20 100 cards are \$32
