



Pee Pee TeePees

Soft, small fabric cones to protect a caregiver from surprise infant boy spraying. Just strategically drop in position when diaper changing to discourage pesky fountains from little baby boys. Make a half dozen to allow washing between changing diapers.

Materials (makes 2 TeePees)

1 piece soft flannel fabric, about 7" square. This will be on the outside.

1 piece soft terry cloth fabric, or wash cloth, about 7" square. This will be on the inside

1 paper half circle template, from a 6" circle cut in half. Use a bowl, circle template, etc.



Steps

1. Layer fabrics right sides together with pattern on top. Cut a half circle. Reposition pattern and cut a second one. Pin or clip layers together, flannel side down.
2. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam around the curved edge. This is easiest done with flannel side down. Turn over and confirm the terry cloth was caught all along the seam. If not, just re-stitch over any gaps.
3. Turn the $\frac{1}{2}$ circle flannel side out. Use fingers or stiletto to smooth seam allowance into the curve. Top stitch the curved edge.
4. With terry side out, fold the piece in half matching the straight raw edges, and making the topstitched corners meet. This will look like a $\frac{1}{4}$ circle.
5. Stitch this short straight seam. Trim any corner seam allowances.



6. Turn flannel side out and push out the cone tip.
