## **Thermal Rice Bag with Removable Cover**

This rice bag can be used as a cold pack by placing it in the freezer or used as a hot pack by heating in the microwave in 30 second intervals until heated. <u>Do not heat more than 60 seconds</u>. Various sizes of bags can be made and other options for necks or shoulders are available on Pinterest.

## Materials:

Fabrics and thread must be 100% cotton to ensure no problems when heated in the microwave.

Inner bag: muslin or fabric cut 6" x 20" – 21"

Cover: fabric cut 7" x 21" Do not cut the selvedge edge off.

 $1\frac{1}{2}$  C rice (not instant)

Measuring cup, large bowl, and optional funnel with opening at least 1/2"

## Instructions:

- 1. Starting with the **inner bag** fabric, fold in half right sides together. Stitch along both outer edges <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" from edge and then again <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" from edge. Trim corners and turn right side out.
- 2. Draw lines on the inner bag at about 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>", 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>", and 9 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" from the bottom of the bag. *Note: You can make the inner bag without sections, but I prefer the sections. The photos show an inner bag without sections.*
- 3. Using the funnel and the large bowl to better contain the rice, pour ½ C of rice into bag and make sure it's at the bottom of the bag. Place about 3 pins directly above the rice to keep it below the line and then stitch twice along the 3 ¼" line.
- 4. Repeat and stitch along the 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" line. Repeat again for the last section, but fold the top edge into the bag and stitch 2 rows across the top of the bag.
- 5. On the short edge of the **cover fabric** without the selvedge, fold about a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " hem. Then fold a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " hem along the raw edge. Stitch the double folded hem.
- 6. Lay the cover fabric out, right side up. Center the inner bag on the fabric.
- 7. Fold the hemmed edge over the bag and be sure it goes beyond the middle of the inner bag.
- 8. Then fold the selvedge edge up and extend it beyond the hemmed edge.
- 9. Pin or clip the two corners on one side, making sure not to catch the inner bag.
- 10. Remove the inner bag and refold the outer bag so that the two short edges still overlap by at least <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" 1". Stitch along both sides <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" from edge and then again <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" from edge. Be sure to double stitch where the two ends overlap.
- 11. Trim corners and turn the cover right side out. Insert the inner bag.
