
## **Kleenex Box Cover Instructions**



Required supplies are:

- Two 14  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of fabric. These should be different. One will be the outside and one will be the lining.
  - One 14 ½" square of fusible interfacing
  - 4 buttons
  - 1 box of Kleenex cube style





1. First step is to fuse the interfacing onto the back of the lining square. Place the two squares together, right sides together. Sew a ¼" seam around all 4 sides of the square, leaving an opening for turning. Where the opening is, turn back the edges ¼" and press.



2. Reach through the opening and turn inside out. Use something to poke out the corners (stiletto, pencil, awl, etc.) Press the edges and then stitch 1/8" from the edges all the way around the square.


3. Fold the square in half and mark the two sides where the fold is with a pin. Next open the square and this time fold it in half along the diagonal. The lining fabric should be on the outside.





4. Where the pins are, pin both layers together. Next sew a short tacking stitch back and forth from the edge to about ¼" from the edge. Do the same thing at the other pin.






5. The next steps are a little challenging at first so take your time. Start by reaching inside and pulling the outside fabric so it's on the outside. Reach your hand inside and start to form the bottom of the cover into a square. It should look something like this picture.



6. Put the Kleenex box inside of the cover and continue to shape it to form around the box. Try to get the sides folded nice and symmetrical.





7. Fold the four flaps down and pin them once you're happy with how they look. Sew button at the points to keep them in place.
